5.	<p>To consider and approve response to planning application N/2020/0112 - Application for the permanent diversion of footpath KN6 - Land To The East Of Hardingstone North Of Newport Pagnell Road There was concern that this historical footpath be rerouted, however the council could appreciate the need for this with the plans for the new housing development. It was proposed there was no objections but a comment to be made about the disappointment. Resolved</p> <p>Cllr Haines joins</p>
6.	<p>To consider and approve whether to support businesses on Brackmills who wish to apply for double yellow lines on Osyth Close There was concern that this would have a knock on effect of excessive parking elsewhere. It was thought Highways would be better placed to know if this was the correct solution for the area. It was asked if the Police safer communities had been consulted, or BID (Brackmill Improvement District) as they may have other solutions. It was proposed that we didn't object in principle but that others would be better placed to make the decision. Resolved.</p>
7.	<p>To consider and approve any response to Hackleton Neighbourhood Plan Consultation It was not thought that this would impact on Hardingstone and it was proposed that the council support their endeavors and wish them luck.</p>
