

Hardingstone Neighbourhood Watch

General parking issues were decriminalised some years ago. All but obstruction offences are now dealt with by West Northants Council (WNC), so they are the contact for most parking issues.

In March 2021 the Wootton-bound bus stop on Newport Pagnell Road, between Mereway roundabout and the Queen Eleanor PH, was hit by a vehicle and had to be removed. After 3 reminders to WNC from NHW it was finally replaced in March 2022.

Despite assurances from West Northants Council, the fallen leaves on High Street, now very compacted and mainly washed into the drains, have not been dealt with. Take care in this area, as the footway between Blue Barns and the Village Hall remains extremely slippery on wet days.

PCSO Lee Shelton attended 'The Well' in March. He answered questions about parking, and shared information on a recent



knife amnesty where 40 knives were handed in outside Tesco. Most of these were kitchen utensils, so nothing alarming. Police are visiting several schools giving talks. People thought his visit was very helpful.

Police are holding a drop-in at 'The Well' on Friday 6th May 10:30 to 11:30am, so come and speak to them and get advice.

Hardingstone Community Mural Project

To commemorate the Platinum Jubilee, the 'Hardingstone Organisations Together' (HOT) group, supported by the parish council, are keen for the whole community to collaborate and create a legacy artwork during this special year.

The western boundary wall of the Rec cries out for a mural to enhance the best public outdoor space in our village. The theme would probably echo that of the Platinum Jubilee Pageant, telling the story of the Queen's 70-year reign and our hopes and aspirations for the planet over the next 70 years.

The idea is that the whole community contributes a drawing or image of something indicative of any of the past or future seven decades, that can be collated into a design for a mural on the Rec wall. There is plenty of wall for everyone who would like to help with some painting-by-numbers, and get involved in creating a fantastic artistic legacy for Hardingstone.

Specialist support is needed for collating the design and to supervise painting the mural onto the wall. Enquiries suggest that the cost of the project using a professional participatory muralist would be around £3,750 - so any offer

of help from a talented local artist who could volunteer to lead on this project would be appreciated.

Sponsorship, grant applications and maybe crowd funding will be sought to cover the costs of the project. *If you can help, please contact the Clerk.*

Meanwhile, do start thinking of the drawing/design that you might contribute, and look out for further information on noticeboards, social media and by word-of-mouth!

Delapre Abbey and Hardingstone

In part two of his series about Delapre Abbey, Bill Lockerbie explores the influence of the Tate family who made this their family seat for over 200 years.

Part 2- The Tate Family 1546-1764

Following the dissolution of the monasteries in 1538 and with the convent now emptied of its contents, the buildings and demesne lands were let to a tenant and eventually sold to John Mershe, a Land Speculator from London. A few years later, sometime between 1546-48, the Abbey was purchased by Anne Saunders of Harrington, who was by then married to Andrew Wadham. Anne's first husband was Bartholomew Tate of Laxton (1486-1532), the son of Sir John Tate (1442-1515), a former Lord Mayor of London. The eldest son from this marriage was also named Bartholomew (I of Delapre) (1529-1601), and it was in his name that the property was registered. It was this Bartholomew who would make Delapre Abbey the principal family seat.

There followed another six generations of Tates to own and live at Delapre, who would then go on to establish themselves as a prominent Northamptonshire family, acting as county sheriffs, JP's and MP's for Northampton. Following the aftermath of the gunpowder plot in 1605, William Tate (1529-1617), son of Bartholomew, and father of Zouch (1606-1650), mastered the militia and led a raid on Harrowden Hall where members of the plot were thought to be hiding. He then led the enquiry into the gunpowder plotter's lands the following year.

Each generation also contributed to the reformation of the fabric of the building, transforming from Abbey to Country House, but it was Zouch Tate, grandson of Bartholomew I of Delapre, who initiated the major conversion of the site, including the impressive West front main entrance and the East range behind, including a kitchen and laundry facility.



Zouch Tate was a zealous parliamentarian and served as MP for Northampton in the long parliament under Charles 1st. After the battle of Naseby in 1645, a series of 39 of the King's letters were captured and almost all individually witnessed as accurate by

Zouch. It was these letters that would form the basis of the trial and execution of Charles $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$. He witnessed the rise of Oliver Cromwell as well as the execution of Charles $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ in 1649 at Whitehall.

Hidden under the Altar in our Church there are two black limestone slabs, with finely engraved Tate coat of arms, indicating the final resting place of Zouch Tate's daughter in law, Mary Stedman of Lincoln's Inn London, wife of William Tate, also William's son Bartholomew (the third) together with his spouse, Mary Noel.

However, it was yet another Bartholomew (III of Delapre, the fourth of that name) who would end the Tate dynasty at Delapre when his daughter passed away unexpectedly, without heirs, only eighteen months after marrying Admiral Sir Charles Hardy, a prominent Royal Navy figure from Portsmouth. Although Hardy would make further improvements to the Abbey, building the stable block and coach house, he would sell the Abbey in 1764 to The Bouverie Family for £22,000. After nearly 220 years, the Tate family association with Hardingstone and Delapre Abbey was over.


Then to celebrate National Hedgehog Day, we held a
