Notes from the Parish Council

The Parish Council are very disappointed about the vandalism that has occurred to the picnic benches in the Recreation ground. This may be a bit of fun for a few for a short time but spoils many peoples' enjoyment of this valuable open space and replacement costs have to be met from your council tax. If you have any information please let the police know.

The Parish Council, with Hardingstone Organisations Together, has been heavily involved in making plans to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. On Thursday 2nd June we are holding a Tea Party for those who may remember the coronation. There are still places available. Please contact the clerk to book your place. There is a family picnic and fun day event on the Rec on Sunday 5th June. See adverts in this magazine, on the noticeboards and social media for more information.

Volunteers and parish councillors, have replanted the floral display around the war memorial garden and we hope the flowers will be in full bloom for the Jubilee. Pictures on P8.

As many of you are aware there are plans to build a new Community Centre as part of the development by Tilia at Landimore Park. The Parish Council has been offered this building, to own and take on the management. The Parish Council has spent a great deal of time considering the pros and cons of taking on this facility. There were some alterations that we asked Tilia to include in the building, but Tilia were not willing to do them, so this, and the fact that we do not have the expertise, led to the council deciding to decline the offer of the building. The centre will still be built, but will probably be run by a private management company. Work has commenced on the bike park on the old Hardingstone 9 golf course. The Parish Council was expecting another meeting to take place with West Northants Council before work started to reiterate our concerns about adverse impacts on the village and the public footpaths. As this did not materialise, a further meeting will be arranged.

After several years of negotiations with solicitors who move at snails pace, it looks as though we might at last be somewhere near completing the acquisition of Cherry Orchard for the village. However we have thought that several times before. We'll let you know if and when it's sealed, signed and delivered.

In early May we held the Annual Parish Meeting. This is not a council meeting but an opportunity for residents to see what is happening in the village. We had several community groups, the Police and West Northants Councillors gave updates and reports. We would like to encourage more residents to attend village and Parish Council meetings. If you have any ideas on how we could entice you to come and see and comment on what is happening in your village please contact the clerk.

Our thanks go to Nick Briddon for his work on the council over the last year. He has just resigned as councillor due to leaving the village. We wish him all the best. This does leave a vacancy on the council, and if anyone is interested in becoming a parish councillor please contact the clerk or an existing councillor for more information.

Hardingstone Neighbourhood Watch

Hardingstone has been experiencing several acts of vandalism and anti-social behaviour during the past two months. Police told residents at a meeting that people were not reporting incidents, so they have not been aware of the scale of some of the problems. They say even if you feel that you or your property has only been slightly interfered with, you should report that to them. If you see anyone damaging or attempting to interfere with items, Police say it's a 999 call, 999 is not just for major incidents. Your call will be triaged. Police need the timing of when several wheelie bins have been knocked over in 3 roads on Thursday nights, when antisocial behaviour on the Rec is



happening and when front gardens or doorbells are being interfered with. Social media posts without Police contact will not reduce these problems. If you are reporting after an event has happened, search 'Northants Police', then 'Report', then select the type of incident from the list. You can ring 101 or



contact PCSO Rebecca (page 2). If you get a reference number then share that.

Our Neighbourhood Warden advises that If a vehicle is blocking the access to your drive you should speak to the driver, if present. If not take a photo & note the time period. This is classed as obstruction and is a POLICE MATTER. Similarly if the footway is impassable for wheelchairs or buggies and necessitates people having to go into the road, this is also obstruction so

If you see suspicious activity report any description of the person involved. Police tell us this could be the final piece of the jigsaw that they are compiling. We have included Sgt Paul's list of various ways of contacting them on page 11. Photographic evidence of incidents taking place, or the offenders moving off are needed. Ring 999 saying what you are witnessing and they will then give you a way of sending pictures to police. If you know where an offender lives or goes to school this will help. photograph it. In either case ring 101 with details including the make, model, colour and registration of the vehicle, or go to Northants Police website and select "Report", then Antisocial Behaviour and work through the form to the end submitting your picture.
