Retirement of HP Source editorial team

The editorial team at HP Source have decided that they will be stepping down from the production and delivery of this newsletter after March next year.

None of us is getting any younger, and health problems raise doubts about our ability to continue to produce HP Source in the longer term, so we feel that now is the time to wind down in an orderly fashion. With the passage of time it has become increasingly difficult to find new material to interest our readers, especially as very few residents and groups seem prepared to submit articles, letters or information for publication.

We created HP Source to fill the gap left when the circulation of 'Forum' suddenly stopped in 2018. We felt that there was a need to keep all residents informed about news and local issues, especially those who don't wish to use computers or their phones to inform them about local affairs. Our

retirement will mark the end of four years in our roles, during which time we will have produced 24 issues of the newsletter.



The Parish Council is looking for a new voluntary publication team to receive items, collate, edit and lay-out the newsletter from next year. Sessions are led by Michelle Lewis, who is fully trained in the OTAGO exercise programme - a world acclaimed fall prevention programme that improves



strength and balance and reduces falls and fall related injuries.

OTAGO is proven to reduce falls and the resulting risk of injury, improve balance, strength and the ability to complete everyday tasks, and to boost confidence and independence.

Sessions take place between 10-10.45am every Thursday morning at Hardingstone Village Hall and cost just £5pp.

Copycat Websites and Online Services

Copycat websites that appear to be legitimate government services and departments are regularly set-up by cyber criminals. They are designed to steal your personal data and payment details or charge extensive handling fees for tasks that are normally free or can otherwise be easily completed online using the actual relevant government website.

Cyber criminals often post fake links on social media or use sponsored ads and other techniques to get their sites to appear in your Google or other search results when looking for an official site covering: driving licences, passports, business grants, blue badges, etc.

Always use the **gov.uk** website portal to find the genuine HMG (UK) government service, department or information you need.

Other Phishing Sites

Similar techniques are used by cyber criminals to get you to visit fake but realistic logon pages or phishing sites to obtain your passwords, personal information and payment details. These may look identical to the genuine online store, social media site, payment service, customer support page or account logon you would expect to see.

Avoid clicking links received via email, text message or social media unless you have verified the source. Fake competitions, quizzes, surveys, discount vouchers and offers are also popular methods used by criminals to get you to click on a link to a phishing site.

- Enable your browser (**safebrowsing.google.com**) or security software web-safe (eg. Microsoft Edge SmartScreen) feature to help avoid known untrusted sites.
- A rudimentary but useful check using a domain/web address can be carried out on: **check.getsafeonline.org**
- Report suspicious websites so they can be checked and removed: **ncsc.gov.uk/section/about-this-website/report-scam-website**

WhatsApp scam

The National Fraud Intelligence Bureau (NFIB) is warning the public about the continued increase in reports about scams where victims are targeted on WhatsApp by criminals pretending to be someone they know – typically their children.

Between 3rd February 2022 and 21st June 2022, there have been a total of 1235 reports made to Action Fraud linked to this scam, with total reported losses

exceeding £1.5mn.

Criminals will usually begin the conversation with “Hello Mum” or “Hello Dad” and will say that they are texting from a new mobile number as their phone was lost or damaged.

STOP. THINK. CALL. If a family member or friend makes an unusual request on WhatsApp, always call the person to confirm their identity.

Stunning hundreds and bowling brilliance as HCC take a step up

Some spectacular individual performances stand out as Hardingstone Cricket Club have taken on their most challenging season to date.

The 1st XI has produced some mixed results in Division 5 of the Northamptonshire Cricket League, but Phil Monkman and James Hill provided eye-catching moments with memorable 100s. The side made a huge jump in standard after winning Division 6 in 2021 with the rearrangement of the league meaning they are now taking on some sides which plied their trade in Division 4 last year.

So far, the 1^{sts} have managed three wins and five defeats to leave themselves in ninth place in a league which is so tight that just 24 points separate them from fourth position. Despite also suffering a raft of injuries to key players, the team has battled hard with Jack Larkin providing runs at the top of the order and Luke Evans among the wickets in his debut season.

Delapre Abbey and Hardingstone

Part three of this series explains why the Bouverie family acquired The Abbey in 1764.

Part 3 1764 -1810: The Bouverie family purchase Delapre Abbey

In 1568 Laurens de Bouverie came to England from Flanders as a Huguenot refugee, eventually becoming a wealthy landowner and businessman. In 1717 Sir Edward des Bouverie purchased Longford Castle near Salisbury and in 1736 Edward's brother, Sir Jacob, changed his name to Bouverie by act of parliament. Sir Jacob would become the first Viscount Folkestone and would go on to marry Mary Clarke of Hardingstone, daughter of Bartholomew and Mary Clarke.

It is considered that Mary's mother, along with her brother Hitch Younge, had the money and the local knowledge to purchase Delapre Abbey in 1764 in the name of her 29 year old grandson Edward. It was the year of his marriage to 14 year old Harriet Fawkener who would become a society lady of London, reputed to be the most beautiful woman in England at the time, so much so her portrait was painted by Joshua Reynolds. On Edward's death in 1810 Harriet would marry Robert Spencer and her memorial plaque to Lady Robert Spencer, can be seen on the South Wall of the Chancel. Edward and Harriet would create the Hardingstone branch of the Bouverie family and an association with the Church and village which would last for nearly 200 years. Longford Castle near Salisbury remains, to this day, the family seat of the Pleydell/Bouverie family.



Edward would become MP for Northampton in 1780 and it is he who added "Abbey" to Delapre either as a symbol of status or a reflection on the mediaeval Nunnery. Edward invested considerably in St Edmund's Church including the commissioning of the Rysbrack monument in the chancel, in honour of his mother, grandparents and Hitch Younge.

Edward and his wife, Harriet produced three sons and five daughters and on his death in 1810 he was succeeded by his eldest son, also Edward (2nd).

Supporters of St. Edmunds

At the annual trustees meeting in June 2022, the following Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year ended 31st March was approved:

The charity's main fundraising event 'Midsummer Merriment' coincided with the easing of lockdown restrictions, and consequently was a great success raising £2,158.

An autumn fayre in the church, organised by the Friends of Hardingstone, was also very well supported, raising £1,562.

The charity was also grateful to Hardingstone Parish Council for grants towards the architects fees for the Reordering Proposals Report required by Peterborough Diocese.

Increased subscriptions, other generous donations and the annual 'Lights for a Loved One' project resulted in total income for the year of £7,222 – an increase of £1,852 on the previous year, and giving a cumulative total of £22,252 since the charity started in January 2018.

Three grants totalling £4,420 were awarded to Hardingstone PCC, towards the new projector and screen (£3,380), for professional fees (£500), and for work on the yew trees (£540).

The year ends with £6,374 in the charity's funds, which is a good base for future challenges.

The project is underway! The Supporters of St Edmunds have raised £5,250 (to date) for the costs of this project, on behalf of the 'Hardingstone Organisations Together' groups. The participatory designing and then painting sessions provide opportunities for every member of the community to work together and enhance the Rec.

Despite Nicki Blanchard being unable to join us for the Jubilee weekend events, ideas for the participatory mural were collected from Hardingstone Academy, Northampton High School, the Scouts and many members of the community. Nicki came to Hardingstone for 2 nights at the end of June to start painting the background of a 'rainbow of hope' in varying shades that are representative of the different decades.

Her visit to transfer the iconic images of the 50s & 60s, for community painting-by-numbers, was then postponed by a week due to further illness. However, 30 girls from Northampton High School painted 3 background colours from the 70s on 4th July.

Painting sessions will continue through July and August for anyone to join in and help complete this legacy artwork – please see poster on page 15 for details. The wall is high, so adults especially needed.

The completion ceremony will be on Saturday 3rd September at 3.30 pm (in accordance with the terms of the grant from NCF's Constance Travis Endowment Fund).

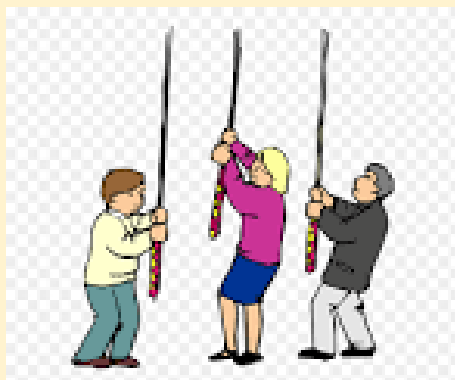

Student talent celebrated in Arts Week

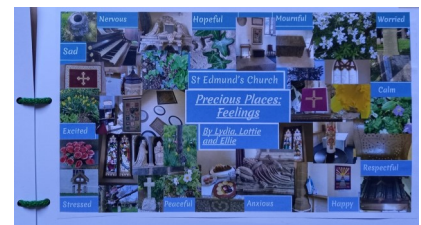
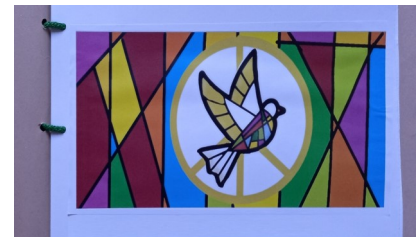
